STUDY IN GREECE 2010-2011

REGULAR MEMBERS

Those Eligible: Graduate students preparing for an advanced degree in classical and ancient Mediterranean studies or a related field. Well-qualified students with a B.A. will be considered for admission and fellowships. Preference, however, is given to those who have completed at least one year of graduate study.

The Program: Requires participation in the nine-month program, including School's trips during the autumn, covering much of the Greek mainland. During the winter quarter, topography sessions, museum visits, and seminars in Athens are required, with some additional trips. In the spring quarter members normally participate in the School's excavations at Corinth and have time for independent research and some optional trips.

Fellowships: Fellows receive a cash stipend of \$11,500 plus room, board and waiver of fees. Up to 12 are available, awarded on the basis of transcripts, recommendations and examinations. Information is included on the web site.

Application: Consists of an application form and letters of recommendation (submitted online at the ASCSA web site), transcripts, and examinations in Greek language, history, and either literature or archaeology.

DEADLINE: JANUARY 15, 2010.

STUDENT ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

Those Eligible: Advanced graduate students in classical, ancient Mediterranean studies, post-classical Greek studies, or related fields who have a specific project that requires extended residence in Greece. Candidates for Associate Membership should clearly state their specific reasons for wanting to work at the School.

The Program: Generally Student Associate Members pursue independent research although they may also participate in the Regular Program when space allows.

Fellowships: Several are available. Information is included on the web site.

Application: Consists of an application form, letters of recommendation, and a detailed statement of the project to be pursued in Greece (submitted online at the ASCSA web site), and transcripts.

DEADLINE: JANUARY 15, 2010.
